NAFSMA's purpose is to advocate public policy and encourage technologies in watershed management that focus on issues relating to flood protection, stormwater and floodplain management in order to enhance the ability of its members to protect lives, property, and economic activity from the adverse impacts of storm and flood waters.

Your Voice in Water Resources Management Issues

The National Association of Flood and Stormwater Management Agencies (NAFSMA) is your voice in Washington, D.C. on such water resources management issues as stormwater management, disaster assistance, flood insurance and federal flood management policy.

Since its founding in 1978, NAFSMA has represented local, regional and state public agencies nationwide. It is an association committed to improving and ensuring the continuation of water resource projects and programs of interest to flood and stormwater management agencies.

NAFSMA achieves these goals through...

Education

NAFSMA works to inform and educate congressional and federal policy makers of the importance of flood prevention, stormwater management, disaster relief assistance and other issues of concern to you.

Presentations

NAFSMA presents information and material supportive of the membership's positions to Congress and administrative agencies. The association has been instrumental in the reauthorization efforts for the Clean Water Act, the Water Resources Development Act, and other critical pieces of legislation.

Coalitions

NAFSMA frequently works with other public interest groups and national trade associations located in Washington, D.C. sharing our interests. It serves as the liaison to these organizations to ensure the interests of membership are well represented.

Special Events

NAFSMA's Annual Meetings and Special Workshops provide opportunities to share information with colleagues and to discuss critical issues with key legislators, congressional staff, administration leaders and regulatory officials.

What Can NAFSMA Do for You?

NAFSMA represents the interests of its members through communication with federal officials and public interest groups. NAFSMA activities include...

Communication

Through timely newsletters and alerts, NAFSMA notifies its members of important legislative and federal policy developments. It is your information link to the Army Corps of Engineers, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Federal Insurance Administration, the Department of Interior and other agencies involved in our issues. Alerts are supplemented by NAFSMA's Flood and Stormwater Management Updates, our newsletter that updates action by Congress, federal agencies and others that affect your activities in flood and stormwater management.

Information

NAFSMA provides technical information and mechanism for sharing ideas, trends and innovations in water resources management.

Committee Activities

NAFSMA members have the opportunity to develop strategies addressing issues of concern to member agencies through regular committee activities and discussions. Standing Committees include:

Flood Management Committee – The Flood Management Committee coordinates and resolves member issues related to federal flood control programs, regulations, and funding. The committee maintains active liaison relationships with the Army Corps of Engineers and other federal agencies involved with federal flood control programs, regulations and funding. Particular emphasis is on the Water Resources Development Act, Clean Water Act, Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Act, National Dam Safety Program and other acts, programs, implementation and/or policy guidance originating in the federal government.

Floodplain Management Committee – The Floodplain Management Committee tracks and influences federal legislation and regulations that affect NAFSMA member's floodplain management programs. This includes the National Flood Insurance Program (mapping issues, LOMRs, CLOMRs, insurance, national mitigation strategy, community rating system and levee policy), "all hazards" insurance and "takings" legislation. The Committee Acts as FEMA liaison and coordinates with the Association of State Floodplain Managers on issues of mutual interest.

Stormwater Management Committee – The Stormwater Management Committee identifies and addresses stormwater quality and quantity issues affecting local governments including tracking, evaluating and making recommendations regarding federal legislation and regulations. The committee coordinates with other associations such as the National Association of Clean Water Agencies, National League of Cities, National Association of Counties, U.S. Conference of Mayors, National Governors' Association and American Public Works Association regarding stormwater quality and quantity management issues.
